

Another Man With Motor Bobs Up--Priest This Time

Not "Fuelless" Nor "Perpetual Motion Machine," But
It Makes Use of "Inter-Atomic" Energy To
Build Up Power Many Times, Inventor Says.

NEW YORK, March 6.—Another man with a motor—this time an Italian priest from Brazil, bobbed up today. While his invention as he explained is neither "fuelless" nor a "perpetual motion machine," it is different from the ordinary motor in that it makes use of "inter-atomic" energy to generate many times the power it receives originally from an electric battery. The motor is now at Washington, where it is undergoing the patent office investigation.

The priest is Padre Antonio D'Angelo, a stocky, earnest little man, who combines missionary work in Brazil with tinkering in his own electrical laboratory.

The priest does not believe in the

Hendershot fuelless motor. "I challenge any one," he said today, "to use the magnetic field of the earth for running a motor. The energy from that would be much too small."

His motor, he said, could be used in the home to supply electric lighting cheaply and even heating. He said that it could be used if it is proved to be practicable to run trains, airplanes, automobiles, etc.

Father Antonio had a plan of his motor with him today. He showed where and how it started to develop energy from an electric battery and how this original impulse worked on the machine to generate many times its power through the electricity produced by the inter-atomic energy of the ion.
