
Motor Inventor Suffers Shock

WASHINGTON, March 9.—(AP)—The whereabouts of **Lester J. Hendershot**, for several days as mysterious as details of his invention, the "fuelless motor," became known today with the discovery that Hendershot has been a patient at Emergency hospital here since Tuesday afternoon.

He was reported to be suffering from an electric shock received while experimenting with his invention, but there was no confirmation of anything except that he was at the hospital. His physician, Dr. William B. Marbury, declined to discuss the case, even refusing to deny or confirm that he attended Hendershot.
