FUELLESS MOTOR

ENERGY FROM AIR CURRENTS.

The New York correspondent of the London "Daily Mail" reported recently: American engineers are interested but puzzled by the invention of a "free energy" motor capable, it is claimed, of running without fuel. The inventor, Mr. Leslie J. Hendershot, describes the energy as drawn directly from electrical currents which exist constantly in the air or in the open ground. He demonstrated the operation of his fuel-less motor to Mr. W. B. Stout, a monoplane designer, who said: "The demonstration was very impressive, almost uncanny."

It is stated that the revolutionary feature was an hitherto unknown manner of winding the armature. Colonel Lindbergh thought it worth while to go to Detroit to see a test of the model, which is about the size of a motor used in an electric vacuum cleaner. But he refused to comment on the invention. Mr. Hendershot has ample financial backing. Newspapers ascribe the origin of the invention to a dream. He converted the dream into a reality, they say, to satisfy the demands of his small son who had a model of an airplane.
